# Membership Information

The Sacramento Valley Shooting Center at 15501 Meiss Road Sloughhouse, CA 95683, is owned and operated by the Folsom Shooting Club Inc. (abbreviated FSC herein). There are five membership classes defined in Article 4 of the FSC Bylaws (abbreviated as BL herein) and discussed below. Some requirements are found in the Policies, Rules, and Procedures (abbreviated as PRP herein) adopted by the FSC Board of Directors as authorized by the FSC Bylaws. The two primary membership classes are the Non-Voting Member and Voting Member. The first step to membership is to become a Non-Voting Member. Only a Non-Voting Member may become eligible to apply to become a Voting Member. The process to become a Voting Member is intended to identify Non-Voting Members who have shown involvement and display a sense of ownership and pride in the FSC.

## Membership Classes, Benefits and Fees

**Voting Member:** Voting Memberships are limited to 2,000 according to the FSC Bylaws. A Voting Member has voting rights and access to all staffed ranges during operating hours, and access to all available unstaffed range facilities with successful completion of an orientation program. Voting Members receive reduced range fees according to the fee schedule and a 15% discount on merchandise purchases. Voting Members may reduce their annual dues by completing a Range Improvement Project. A Range Improvement Project requires 10 hours work per year, except that projects by Voting Members who are age 60 or more require 5 hours of work per year. Range Improvement Projects must be approved in advance by the FSC Operations Manager. Annual Voting Member Dues are \$175.00 for persons not yet 60 years of age, and \$125.00 for persons of at least 60 years of age. A Fee Schedule is provided below.

**Non-Voting Member:** Non-Voting Members have reduced cost access to the public ranges 1, 3 and 4, seven days a week. Non-Voting Members may have access to private ranges 2, 5 through 12, as a guest of a Voting Member or as part of a club match or other event open to the public. Non-Voting Members receive reduced range fees according to the Fee Schedule and a 10% discount on merchandise purchases. Annual Non-Voting Member Dues are \$150.00 for persons not yet 60 years of age, and \$100.00 for persons of at least 60 years of age. A Fee Schedule is provided below.

**Junior Member:** A Junior Member is the child of any member, and who is not yet 18 years of age. A Junior Member has all rights of the parent member except the Junior Member may not vote or hold office. There are no annual Membership Dues. There are no Range fees except at Range #1, Shotgun.

**Associate Member:** An Associate Member is the spouse or Registered Domestic Partner of a member and has all the same benefits as the member, except the Associate Member may not vote or hold office.

**Life Member:** A Voting Member granted Life Membership by motion of the Board of Directors.

## **Non-Voting Member Eligibility**

1. Must be at least 18 years of age.
2. Must be an NRA member in good standing.
3. Must be able to legally possess firearms in California.
4. Must personally submit a completed Non-Voting Member Application to the Main Range Office. The application must be accompanied by the Non-Voting Member annual dues, which may be prorated based on the number of months remaining in the calendar year, but no less than 50% of the annual dues, and for only first-time applicants who have never been an FSC member.

## **Voting Member Eligibility**

1. Must be at least 18 years of age.
2. Must be an NRA member in good standing.
3. Must be able to legally possess firearms in California.
4. Must have been a Non-Voting Member in good standing for a period of at least 12 months.
5. Must attend at least one meeting of the Board of Directors for the Folsom Shooting Club.
6. Applicants must have completed 10 hours of Range Improvement Work, except those applicants of at least 60 years of age must complete 5 hours of work.
7. Pay the non-refundable Voting Member Application Fee of \$100 at the Main Range Office.
8. Must submit a completed application along with proof of the Application Fee payment and a Work Hour Record signed by the FSC Operations Manager, to the FSC Secretary at any open meeting of the Board of Directors. Board of Director meetings are held on the last Wednesday of each month at the time and site listed on the FSC website.

## **Administration of Voting Member Applications**

The Board of Directors will make the final decision on Voting Member applications during open meetings of the Board of Directors. If a decision cannot be made upon receiving an application, the decision will be made at the next open meeting of the Board.

**Note:** The provisions of this document are summations of the FSC Bylaws and adopted Policies, Rules, and Procedures. Should there be an error or conflict with the FSC Bylaws or adopted Policies, Rules, and Procedures, within this document, the provisions of the FSC Bylaws and Policies, Rules, and Procedures shall prevail.
